

# **Rules & Regulations**

Juniors: Junior membership is for ages 6-11 (novice) and 12-18 (not 19 before Sept 1/14). Children under 10 not permitted on course unless playing golf. Juniors are permitted to tee off weekdays before 4pm; weekends after 4pm. Juniors not permitted in the lounge during adult/senior only functions. Fairway tees may be added to shorten the course and increase pace of junior play. Please consult the Club's policy on Junior golfers for a detailed outline of Junior privileges and responsibilities.

Intermediate: Intermediate I membership is for golfers who do not turn 26 before Sept 1/14. Intermediate II membership is for golfers who do not turn 40 before Sept 1/14. Intermediate members are eligible to participate in all adult member functions. Intermediate aged players do not qualify for inclusion under a family plan with their parents, even if they live in the same household.

**Pro Shop:** Open 1/2 hour before the first tee time each day, thru

#### dusk.

**Check-In:** ALL golfers must check in at the Pro Shop before proceeding to #1 tee. Anyone wishing to start off #10 MUST have permission from the Pro Shop.

Tee Times: Members and visitors can book tee times up to 7 days in advance; exceptions MAY be made for travelers vacationing away from home; please consult with the Pro Shop. Please honor your tee time or call to cancel; refer to the Club's policy on Tee Times for more detail on "no shows".

Sunday Tee Times: The following tee times will be reserved for Club members except when we're hosting a Club, provincial or national event: 1st tee—7am thru 10am; 10th tee—7am thru 12 noon. Pro Shop staff will be grouping golfers into foursomes at busy times, including weekends and holidays. Speed of Play: It is expected that a round of 18 holes will take 4 hours and 20 minutes to complete. The Club will utilize a player assistant to facilitate the appropriate pace of play at busy times. Alcoholic Beverages: Liquor laws of the province of New Brunswick and the requirements of our license strictly prohibit the consumption of alcohol not purchased from the Club on Club property. Our beverage cart and halfway house operate to serve your refreshment requirements. Hours of operation will be posted daily outside near the Pro Shop entrance. Dress Code: All golfers should be familiar with the Club's policy on dress code. Dress that does not adhere to the policy will not be tolerated. Conduct: Improper behavior, abusive or profane language will not be tolerated. Power Carts: Improper use of power carts may result in suspen-

sion of golf privileges. **Complaints:** Operational complaints should be directed to the General Manager. If a satisfactory response is not received, the complaint should be put in writing to the Board of Directors.
